We were all very saddened to hear the news that Gill North passed away of mesothelioma on 23 December, 2021, aged 61. Gill's last academic position was as professor in the law school at Deakin University and an adjunct associate professor in the law school of the University of Western Australia. She was also at Monash Law School for a period of time.

Prior to joining academia, Gill worked in senior management positions at multinational corporations and investment banks in London, Tokyo, New York and Sydney. She drew on her diverse background and experience as a chartered accountant and experienced financial analyst in her academic work that examined policies and conduct that might promote longer term and more sustainable decision making by corporations and improve the fairness, efficiency and transparency of financial markets.

After receiving her diagnosis in 2018, Gill devoted the last three years of her life to the charity she founded, Asbestos Awareness Australia, and to researching the dangers of asbestos to home renovators.

Gill contributed greatly to our association, serving as a member of the Executive and as Treasurer. If you wanted something done, Gill was the person you would ask to do it. One of her aims was to make sure that the CLTA conference was accessible to all corporate law scholars, and she established a great working relationship with our sponsors.

On her personal webpage Gill said "I endeavour to live life to the full". Those of us who knew Gill know that she certainly achieved that. She leaves a wonderful legacy – in both her academic work and her charity, and her company at our conferences is sadly missed.
